Through various Community development programme, Chalice Educational sponsorship programme, Non formal education, Children's parliament, Tribal developments, networking with government, St. Euphrasia's women's multipurpose co- operative society, and Good shepherd skills training cum production center and weaving providing job opportunities for the economically poorer women.

1. Good Shepherd Rural Development and Sustainability

This initiative focuses on improving the quality of life in rural areas through sustainable practices. It often includes programs for agriculture, water management, and renewable energy. 2. Good Shepherd Skills Training cum Production Centre

4. St. Euphrasia's Women's Multipurpose Co-operative Society

6. Pastoral ministry and Family visit

The children we care belong to these categories. Children from broken families Orphans and semi orphans, large family, with no means, sickly parents, Scheduled tribes and Dalits neglected children Poor families.

Distribution of Note books to Students

In our ongoing effort to support education, we proudly distributed to 41 students the notebooks cross various schools. This initiative aims to en sure that students have the essential resources they need to succeed in their studies.



Through MCKS Trustee we have distributed ration kits to the most vulnerable members of our community. The total nutrition kits to 220 individuals, including senior citizens, physically challenged persons, widows, and destitute individuals across eight villages.

Distribution Details:

Nutrition kits were distributed in Martalli, Palimedu, Sandanapalaya, Neluru, Dinnahalli, Methugana and Tandamedu. This initiative targeted elderly residents and those facing significant hardships, ensuring they receive essential nutrients for their health and well-being.





Skill Training

Skill training in tailoring at for 84 women at Hoogiya, Kerrepathi and Dinnahalli received certificate.
